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Structure of agricultural holdings

United Kingdom 2003

A farm structure survey was carried out in all EU member states in 2003 (2002 in Poland). The detailed results are now available for 10 Member States: Belgium, Denmark, Ireland, Latvia, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, Finland, Sweden and the United Kingdom. Results for the other Member States will become available in the course of the next months. This Statistics in Focus is part of a series of country-specific publications, all following the same structure.

In 2003, in the United Kingdom, 181 800 agricultural holdings had an economic size of at least one ESU (European size unit)*, which means a 0.4% increase compared to 2000**.


- These holdings employed 308 000 AWUs (annual work unit), the equivalent of 308 000 persons working full time;
- they made use of almost 15.5 million ha of agricultural area, which is on average 85.2 hectare per holding (compared to 84.6 ha in 2000).


Amongst these 181 800 agricultural holdings:

- 27% made use of less than one AWU, while 57% made use of 2 or more AWUs;
- 14% used less than 5 ha, while 22% used more than 100 ha;
- 9% were mixed holdings, while 91% were specialised: various grazing livestock including sheep 29%, cattle fattening and rearing 21%, dairy 13%, cereals, oil seed and protein crops 16%, field cropping 6%, pigs and poultry 3%, horticulture 3% (of which 68% under glass);
- 1.4% practised organic farming.

Amongst the 180 100 sole holders,


- 12% were women:
- 54% were aged 55 or more, and not more than 4% were younger than 35 years;
- 23% had another gainful activity as major occupation.







- * ESU measures the economic size of the holdings (see methodological notes).

METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The survey on the structure of agricultural holdings in the countries of the United Kingdom was carried out in 2003 using both exhaustive and sample surveys or their combination. The reference time in case of livestock and land area was beginning of June 2003 (1st in Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland, 5th in England); for labour force data, 12 months up to end of September 2003 in England and Wales, and end of February 2003 in Scotland and Northern Ireland.

The target population was all active farms in each country included in the continuously updated Census Registers for the June survey. For the labour force surveys, however, 65 thousand units were allocated proportionally (using number of total holdings) among the countries. In England and Wales sample surveys were organised in June and October. In Scotland the March survey was sample-based, while in June all active big holdings (at least 1 ha farmed land and at least 1 2/3 ESU and/or full-time farmer and significant poultry stock or horticulture) were included. In Northern Ireland a combined method was used: all active farms, except the very small ones where 50% sample was drawn. The samples were stratified by size and, in case of the March or October surveys, by type. The sampling ratios were 5% to 100% depending on the strata (with a higher ratio in the case of bigger holdings or of new holdings). The sampling was a random one.

The data are multi-level checked. The non-responding units and the missing/incorrect data were handled partly by imputation (previous data taking into account trends, data of similar holdings or administrative sources) partly by raising the estimation factors of the strata. In a few cases, units were contacted by phone.

For each activity ('enterprise') on a farm (for instance wheat, dairy cow or vineyard), a **standard gross margin (SGM)** is estimated, based on the area (or the number of heads) and a regional coefficient. The sum of such margins in a farm is its **economic size**, expressed in **European Size Units (ESU)**. 1 ESU is equal to 1200 euros.

Due to differences in the coverage of units of less than 1 ESU across Member States, these data are not comparable between countries. That is why the present analysis and graphs focus on the holdings of at least one ESU.

Each farm is classified in the community typology by its economic size and its **type of farming**, depending on the share of each enterprise in its economic size. For instance, a farm where breeding sows account for more than 2/3 of the economic size is classified as *specialist pig rearing* (type 5011). Depending on the level of aggregation, farms are grouped into 8 to 70 types.

Annual working unit (AWU) means the labour force working yearly like a worker employed on full time basis, it is 1800 hours (225 working days of 8 working hours per day).
