

# Struktur der landwirtschaftlichen Betriebe

## Niederlande 2003

Im Jahr 2003 wurde in allen EU-Mitgliedstaaten eine Betriebsstrukturerhebung durchgeführt (Polen 2002). Ausführliche Ergebnisse liegen nun für 11 Mitgliedstaaten vor: Belgien, Dänemark, Irland, Lettland, Luxemburg, Ungarn, Malta, Niederlande, Finnland, Schweden und Vereinigtes Königreich. Die Ergebnisse für die übrigen Mitgliedstaaten werden im Laufe der nächsten Monate verfügbar werden. Diese Statistik kurz gefasst ist Teil einer Reihe von länderspezifischen Veröffentlichungen, denen alle die gleiche Struktur zu Grunde liegt.

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**Im Frühjahr 2003 gab es in den Niederlanden etwa 85 400\* landwirtschaftliche Betriebe, d.h. 16% weniger als 2000.**

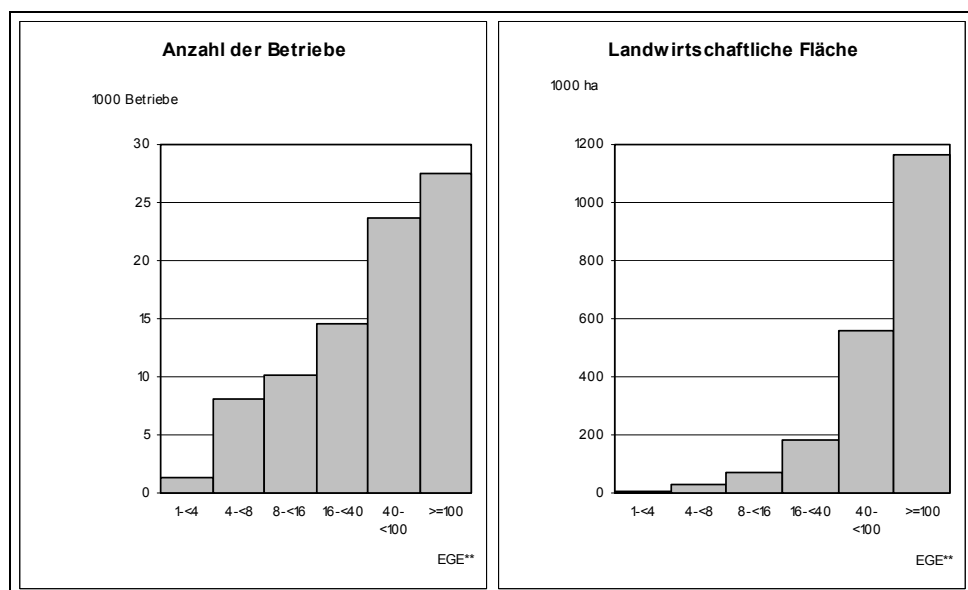
- Diese Betriebe beschäftigten 185 800 JAE (Jahresarbeitsseinheiten), was 185 800 Vollbeschäftigten entspricht;
- sie bewirtschafteten eine landwirtschaftliche Fläche von 2 Millionen ha, durchschnittlich 23,5 ha pro Betrieb (gegenüber 20 ha im Jahr 2000).

Von diesen 85 400 Betrieben:

- beschäftigten 23% weniger als eine JAE, während 36% der Betriebe 2 oder mehr JAE beschäftigten;
- 30% bewirtschafteten weniger als 5 ha, 2% mehr als 100 ha;
- 10% waren gemischte Betriebe, während 90% spezialisiert waren: 26% auf Milcherzeugung, 22% auf Schafe, Ziegen und anderes Weidevieh, 13% auf Ackerbau, 13% auf Gartenbau (davon 60% unter Glas), 7% auf Veredlung, 5% auf Dauerkulturen, 3% auf Rinderaufzucht und Mastbetriebe, 1% auf Getreide-, Ölsaaten- und Eiweißpflanzenbau;
- etwa 1% der Betriebe betrieb ökologischen Landbau.

Von den 81 900 alleinigen Betriebsinhabern waren:

- 7% Frauen;
- 42% 55 Jahre oder älter;
- 13% mit einer außerbetrieblichen Tätigkeit als Hauptberuf.

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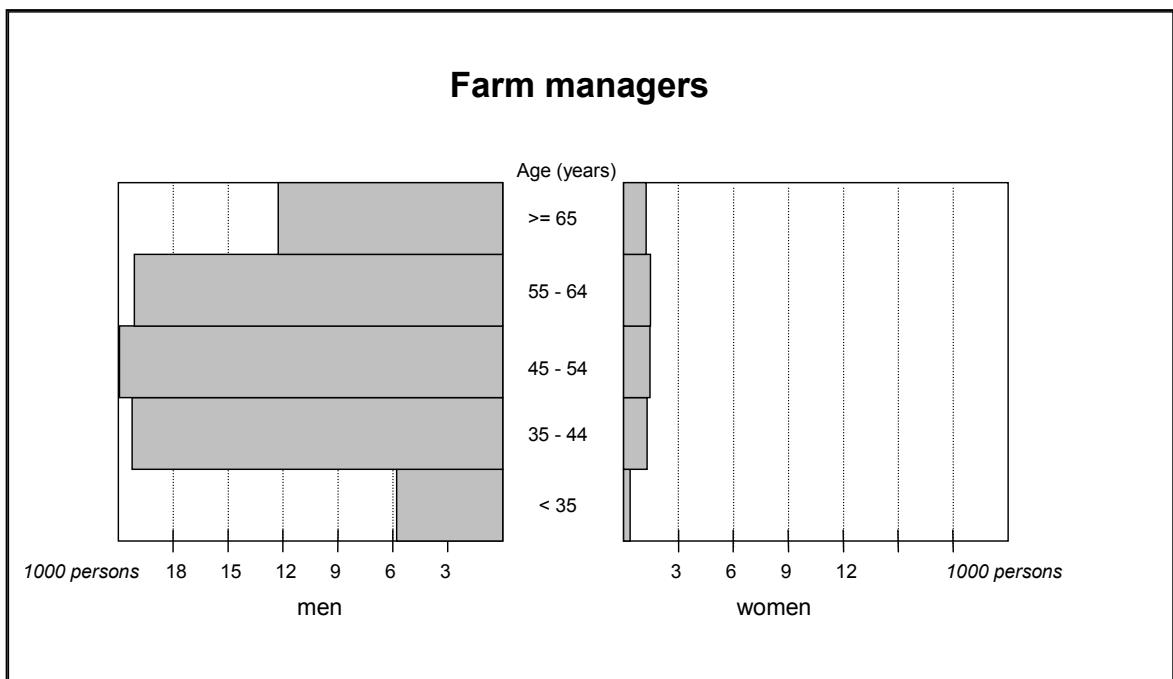
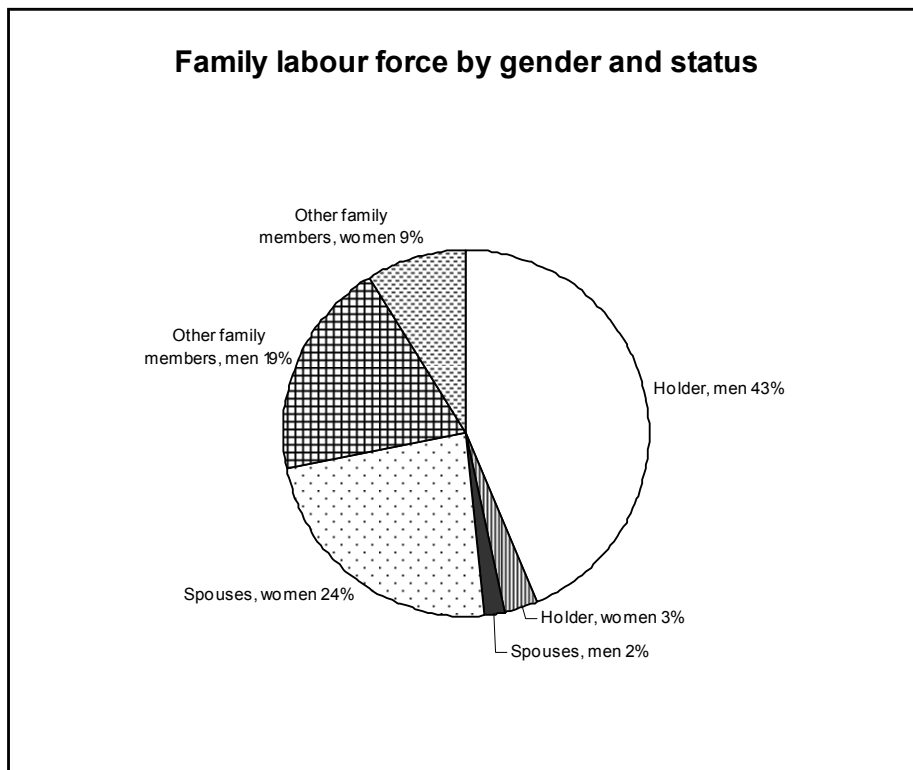
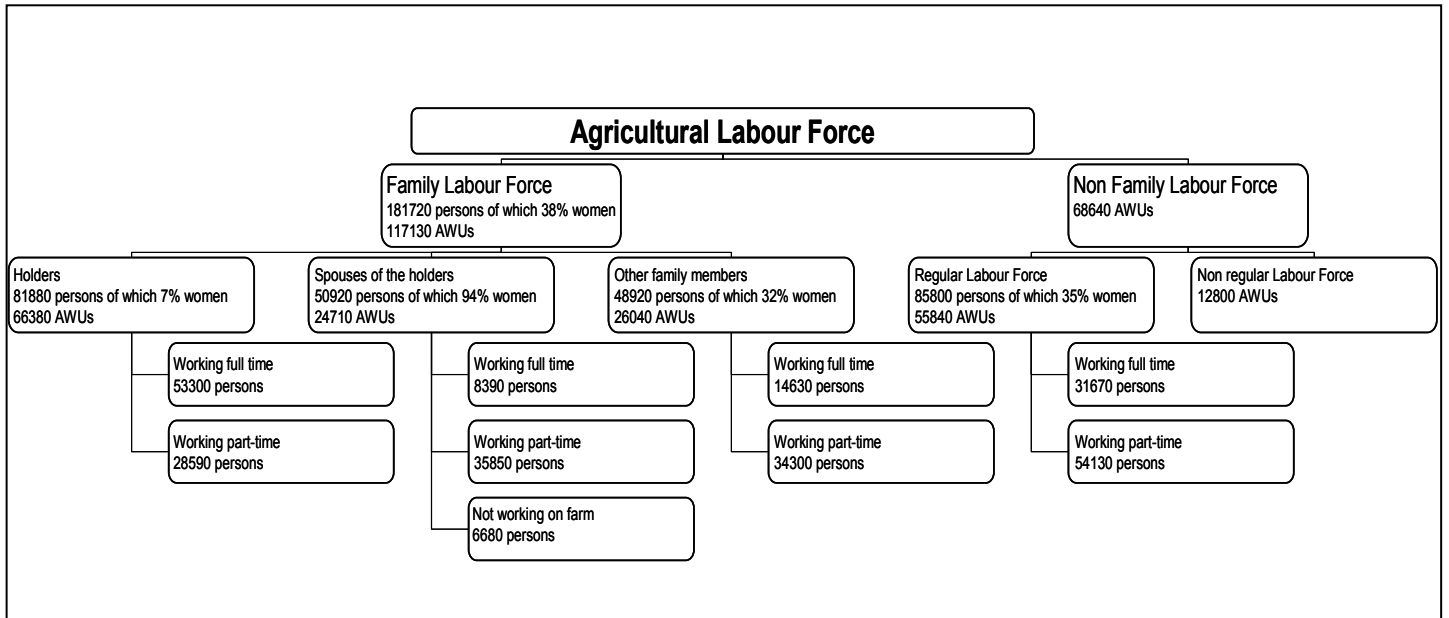

## ► METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The survey on the structure of agricultural holdings in The Netherlands was carried out in the spring 2003 on an exhaustive base. Such full-scale agricultural censuses have been conducted on an annual basis since 1934. The reference time of the FSS 2003 was 1 April 2003. However for characteristics that cannot be determined on this date the situation for later in 2003 or the whole year was taken into account.

The target population was all the farms registered in the National Farm Register, which is updated continuously. For the census all holdings above 3 NGE (Nederlandse Grootte Eenheid) are selected (97 thousand farms in 2003). [The NGE is the Dutch equivalent of the ESU, but due to the differences in inflation levels 1 NGE is 1375 euros in the concerning year.] For certain characteristics (e.g. environmental aspects, less-favoured and set-aside areas) administrative sources and Geographic Information System have been used.

The data are multi-level checked; 99% of the questionnaires have been returned completed. Partly completed forms and errors have been corrected via phone-calls.

For each activity ('enterprise') on a farm (for instance wheat, dairy cow or vineyard), a **standard gross margin (SGM)** is estimated, based on the area (or the number of heads) and a regional coefficient. The sum of such margins in a farm is its **economic size**, expressed in **European Size Units (ESU)**. 1 ESU is equal to 1200 euros.

Due to differences in the coverage of units of less than 1 ESU across Member States, these data are not comparable between countries. That is why the present analysis and graphs focus on the holdings of at least one ESU.

Each farm is classified in the community typology by its economic size and its **type of farming**, depending on the share of each enterprise in its economic size. For instance, a farm where breeding sows account for more than 2/3 of the economic size is classified as *specialist pig rearing* (type 5011). Depending on the level of aggregation, farms are grouped into 8 to 70 types.

**Annual working unit (AWU)** means the labour force working yearly like a worker employed on full time basis, it is 1800 hours (225 working days of 8 working hours per day).
