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Structure of agricultural holdings

Lithuania 2003

A farm structure survey was carried out in all EU Member States in 2003 (2002 in Poland). The detailed results are now available for Belgium, Denmark, France, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, the Netherlands, Slovenia, Finland, Sweden and the United Kingdom. Results for the other Member States will become available in the course of the next months. This Statistics in Focus is part of a series of country-specific publications, all following the same structure.

In Lithuania, in June 2003 about 89 400 agricultural holdings had an economic size of at least 1 ESU (European Size Unit)*.

- These holdings employed 120 700 AWUs (annual work units), the equivalent of 120 700 persons working full time;

- they made use of 1.8 million ha of agricultural area, which is on average 20.4 hectare per holding.

Amongst these 89 400 agricultural holdings,

- 44% made use of less than one AWU, while 9% made use of 2 or more AWUs;


- 20% used less than 5 ha, while 2% used 100 ha or more;

- 71% were mixed holdings, while 29% were specialised: dairies 11%, field cropping 8%, cereals, oil seed and protein crops 6%, various grazing livestock 2%, horticulture 1% (of which 68% under glass) and permanent crops 1%;


- about 0.3% practised organic farming.

Amongst the 88 800 sole holders

- 38% were women;
- 52% were aged 55 or more, and only 7% younger than 35 years;
- 17% had another gainful activity as major occupation.

>METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The survey on the structure of agricultural holdings in Lithuania was carried out in the June 2003 on an exhaustive base. Such a full-scale agricultural census had been conducted last time in 1930. The reference time of the agricultural census 2003 was 1st June 2003. However for crops, it was the harvest year 2003, and for labour force characteristics the period of 1st June 2002 until 31st May 2003.

The target population was all the holdings, enterprises or agricultural companies producing agricultural products or providing agricultural services. The list of target population was compiled from different administrative data-sources (farm register, business register, cattle register, land cadastre). The questionnaire had to be filled in by units having at least 1 ha agricultural area or less then 1 ha agricultural area, but with an annual income from agricultural activity of at least 5000 LTL (5000 Lithuanian Litas ~ 1300 euros). The smaller units were listed only on household enumeration list.

The data are multi-level checked. Partly completed forms and errors have been corrected via contact with the farmers.

For each activity (`enterprise`) on a farm (for instance wheat, dairy cow or vineyard), a **standard gross margin (SGM)** is estimated, based on the area (or the number of heads) and a regional coefficient. The sum of such margins in a farm is its **economic size**, expressed in **European Size Units (ESU)**. 1 ESU is equal to 1200 euros.

Due to differences in the coverage of units of less than 1 ESU across Member States, these data are not comparable between countries. That is why the present analysis and graphs focus on the holdings of at least one ESU.

Each farm is classified in the community typology by its economic size and its **type of farming**, depending on the share of each enterprise in its economic size. For instance, a farm where breeding sows account for more than 2/3 of the economic size is classified as *specialist pig rearing* (type 5011). Depending on the level of aggregation, farms are grouped into 8 to 70 types.

Annual working unit (AWU) means the labour force working yearly like a worker employed on full time basis, it is 1800 hours (225 working days of 8 working hours per day).

The date of extraction of the data used for this Statistics in Focus corresponds to the date of completion of the manuscript.
