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Structure of agricultural holdings Romania 2002

A farm structure survey was carried out in all EU Member States in 2003 (2002 in Poland). Apart from detailed results for the Member States, corresponding data are now also available for Romania (2002) and Norway. This Statistics in Focus is part of a series of country-specific publications on these results, all following the same structure.

In Romania in December 2002, about 1 211 800 agricultural holdings had an economic size of at least 1 ESU (European Size Unit)*.


- These holdings employed 1 437 500 AWUs (annual work units), the equivalent of 1 437 500 persons working full time;
- they made use of about 10.6 million ha of agricultural area, which is on average 8.8 hectare per holding.


Amongst these 1 211 800 agricultural holdings

- 53% made use of less than one AWU, while 10% made use of 2 or more AWUs:
- 81% used less than 5 ha, while 1% used 50 ha or more;
- 79% were mixed holdings, while only 21% were specialised: for cereals, oil seed and protein crops 6%, field cropping 5%, pigs and poultry 4%, fruit orchards 3%, sheep, goats and other grazing livestock 1%, dairies and cattle fattening and rearing 1% and horticulture 1% (of which 51% under glass).

Amongst the 1 197 600 sole holders


- 19% were women;
- 70% were aged 55 or more, and only 5% younger than 35 years;
- 11% had another gainful activity as major occupation.






▶METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The survey on the structure of agricultural holdings in Romania was carried out between 2 December 2002 and 31 January 2003 on an exhaustive base. Prior to this agricultural census such general full-scale census has been conducted last time in 1948. Only specialised agricultural data collections were organised on livestock, fruit trees and vineyards. The reference date of the farm structure survey was for livestock 1 December 2002. For labour force characteristics, the reference period were the 12 months prior to 1 December 2002; for land use, irrigation and non-agricultural activities the crop year between 1 October 2001 and 30 September 2002.

The target population was all agricultural holdings and individual agricultural households, with an agricultural holding being defined as a technical-economic unit of agricultural production under single administration which utilised agricultural area in the 2001-02 crop year and/or had livestock on 1 December 2002. Individual agricultural households were also surveyed because their contribution to the overall agricultural production is considerable. For natural persons' holdings an area frame was applied, for legal persons' holdings a list frame.

The data are multi-level checked. Missing or incorrect data were corrected by follow-up interviews or using automatic corrections based on the correlations within the questionnaire. Unit non-response was not treated.

For each activity ('enterprise') on a farm (for instance wheat, dairy cow or vineyard), a **standard gross margin (SGM)** is estimated, based on the area (or the number of heads) and a regional coefficient. The sum of such margins in a farm is its **economic size**, expressed in **European Size Units (ESU)**. 1 ESU is equal to 1200 euros.

Due to differences in the coverage of units of less than 1 ESU across Member States, these data are not comparable between countries. That is why the present analysis and graphs focus on the holdings of at least one ESU.

Each farm is classified in the community typology by its economic size and its **type of farming**, depending on the share of each enterprise in its economic size. For instance, a farm where breeding sows account for more than 2/3 of the economic size is classified as *specialist pig rearing* (type 5011). Depending on the level of aggregation, farms are grouped into 8 to 70 types.

Annual working unit (AWU) means the labour force working yearly like a worker employed on full time basis, it is 1960 hours (245 working days of 8 working hours per day).
