BALANCE OF CURRENT TRANSACTIONS OF CANDIDATE COUNTRIES: ANNUAL DATA 1995-1998


In spite of the surpluses recorded by most of the candidate countries in the accounts of services and current transfers, their current balances tended to be in deficit between 1995 and 1998. The composition of services showed a strong emphasis on exports of travel services and imports of "other services".

Changes in the current account balance of countries applying for membership of the European Union¹: persistent deficit due to goods and income accounts

From 1995 to 1998 most of the 13 candidate countries recorded current balance deficits. As a rule, these deficits stayed below ECU 3 billion. Three countries stood out, however:

- Poland, where after a surplus of ECU 653 million in 1995, the current account balance registered a steady decline, which reached a record deficit of ECU 6.2 billion in 1998;
- Slovenia, where the current account balance remained in equilibrium between 1995 and 1998;
- Turkey, where the deficit hovered around ECU 2 billion between 1995 and 1997 before turning into a surplus of ECU 1.7 billion in 1998.

ECU mio Figure 1: Current account balance of candidate countries



for Slovakia, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania, and 5% for Hungary, Poland, Romania, Cyprus and Malta.

It was close to 0% for Bulgaria, Slovenia and Turkey. While the figure was virtually stable between 1995 and 1998 for Romania, Slovenia, Lithuania and Turkey, it showed an upward trend in the case of Poland, Estonia and Latvia and a downward trend for Malta.

After accounting for 2% of GDP in 1995, the current account balance of Slovakia reversed in the following year and stood at -10% of GDP in 1998.

Between 1995 and 1998 the ratio of the current account balance on GDP ranged between 4% and -12%


in the various candidate countries. In 1998 the ratio of the current deficit on the GDP was about 10%

Trade in services with the rest of the world: positive balances in 1998

In 1998 Romania was the only candidate country where trade in services recorded a deficit.

With the exception of Romania and Latvia, the candidate countries enjoyed a sizable surplus in the travel services account in 1998.

The biggest surplus for exports of services (ECU 20.8 billion) was achieved by Turkey, mainly due to "other services".



² GDP at current prices


Structure of services: breakdown into transport services, travel services and other services

The structure of **exports of services** (broken down into transport, travel and other services) remained fairly stable between 1995 and 1998 for each of the 13 candidate countries.

The island countries of Cyprus and Malta, where exports of travel services accounted for more than 19% of GDP in 1998, are economies that rely heavily on tourism. Travel services accounted for more than 50% of their total exports of services in 1998.

However, travel services also accounted for a large percentage of exported services in Hungary (59%), Slovenia (55%) and the Czech Republic (50%).

In the case of Latvia, transport services accounted for a remarkable 63% of total exports of services. The situation was similar, but with lower



figures, in Estonia (48%), in Romania (41%) and Lithuania (39%).


Turkey exported mainly "other services", which account for 56% of

its total exports of services. The breakdown of transport, travel and other services is fairly even in Poland.

"Other services" account for the bulk of **imports of services** in Poland (64%), Hungary (62%), Slovakia (58%), the Czech Republic (55%) and Turkey (56%).

Transport services are the biggest component of imported services for Cyprus, Malta, Estonia and Bulgaria.

In the case of Latvia, travel services account for 40% of total imports of services. There is a fairly even breakdown of transport, travel and other services in Lithuania and Slovenia.



➤ ESSENTIAL INFORMATION – METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The data used in this edition of Statistics in Focus are taken from the Balance of Payment statistics supplied by each candidate country. The methodological framework is that of the fifth edition of the *International Monetary Fund (IMF) Balance of Payments Manual*.

The "other services" referred to in this report cover communications services, construction services, insurance services, financial services, computer and information services, royalties and licence fees, other business services, personal, cultural and recreational services, government services n.i.e. and services not allocated.
