

# First results of the demographic data collection for 1999 in Europe

## Joint Council of Europe/Eurostat demographic data collection

This is the third publication from the joint data collection exercise carried out by the Council of Europe and Eurostat. The country coverage is included in the tables and in the Glossary on the following pages.

The objective of this publication is to provide some basic demographic information for 1999. However, given the timetable (rapid questionnaire sent out in May 2000 with a return date of June), not all countries could provide all the information while some figures are provisional or estimates. Additional and/or more definitive information will be published in the annual reports of the Council of Europe ("Recent demographic developments in Europe 2000") and Eurostat ("Demographic Statistics 2000")

### Main demographic trends for 1999

The population of the European Union grew slightly again in 1999, by 0.3 per cent. The small increase compared with the 0.2 per cent in 1998 (and 1997) was due to a slightly higher figure for net inward migration (0.20 per cent in 1999 compared with 0.14 per cent in 1998). Once again many countries in Central and Eastern Europe continued to witness a drop in population size, the highest figures being seen in the Ukraine (0.8 per cent), Latvia (0.6 per cent) and the Russian Federation, Hungary and Bulgaria (each with a population loss of 0.5 per cent). The major cause of these losses was natural decrease (see Tables 1 and 2).

The annual total fertility rate showed very little change in 1999 compared with 1998 in most European Union countries. However, in twelve of the fifteen countries there was a small increase, the largest being seen in Luxembourg (1.73 in 1999 compared with 1.68 in 1998) and Finland (1.74 in 1999 compared with 1.70 in 1998). In three countries there was a small decrease (see Table 3).

Outside the EU, the lowest rates in 1999 were observed in the Czech Republic (1.13), Latvia (1.16) and the Russian Federation (1.17), a level of fertility not dissimilar from that in Italy and Spain.

Table 3 also shows that the proportion of live births outside marriage continues to increase virtually everywhere in Europe. More than about half of all live births were outside marriage in Sweden, Estonia, Iceland and Norway and over 40 per cent in Denmark and France. The lowest levels of pre-marital births were observed in Southern European countries.

Death rates continue to decline, including the infant mortality rate. In the European Union, there were 5 infant deaths under one year of age per 1,000 live births in 1999 compared with 5.2 in 1998 and 12.4 in 1980. As a result of falling mortality rates, the expectation of life at birth for both males and females continue to rise. Based on 1999 mortality rates, a man living in the European Union can expect to live to 74.6 years and a woman to 80.9 years. In contrast a man from the Russian Federation has an expectation of life at birth of 59.8 years (compared with 61.5 years in 1980) and a woman 72.2 years (compared with 73.1 years in 1980). The highest expectation of life at birth for men were observed in Iceland and Sweden (over 77 years) and, for women, in Spain, France, San Marino and Switzerland (over 82 years). More details are given in Table 4.

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Figure 1: World population, 2000




Figure 2: Share of the world's population increase, 1999





Figure 3: Components of population change, 1999



## GLOSSARY

**Natural increase:** the difference between the number of live births and the number of deaths.

**Net migration:** the difference between the number of immigrants and the number of emigrants. In this publication, it is calculated by taking the difference between total population increase and natural increase.

**Crude rate:** the ratio of the number of events to the mean population in a given year.

**Total fertility rate:** the average number of children that would be born alive to a woman during her lifetime if current age specific fertility rates were to continue.

**Infant mortality rate:** the ratio of deaths of children under one year of age to the live births in a given year.

**Life expectancy at birth:** the average number of years a person would live if current age specific mortality rates were to continue.

**Council of Europe Member States:** all the European Union countries, Andorra (AND), Albania (ALB), Bulgaria (BGR), Croatia (HRV), Cyprus (CYP), Czech Republic (CZE), Estonia (EST), Hungary (HUN), Iceland (ISL), Latvia (LVA), Liechtenstein (LIE), Lithuania (LTU), Malta (MLT), Moldova (MDA), Norway (NOR), Poland (POL), Romania (ROM), Russian Federation (RUS), San Marino (SMR), Slovak Republic (SVK), Slovenia (SVN), Switzerland (CHE), the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (MKD), Turkey (TUR), Ukraine (UKR).

**Council of Europe non-Member States with observer status:** Armenia (ARM), Azerbaijan (AZE), Belarus (BLR), Bosnia and Herzegovina (BIH), Georgia (GEO), the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (YUG).

**More developed countries:** all countries in Europe (including European members of the CIS-Commonwealth Independent States), Australia, Canada, Japan, New Zealand, Turkey, the United States of America.

**Less developed countries:** all countries excluding more developed countries
